



How it works

Since 1990, Emeryville has required developers to contribute a percentage of building costs to public art. This has led to a rich collection of both publicly-owned and privately-owned art accessible to everyone.

As of 2024, Emeryville displays

- 55+ publicly-owned artworks (around 250 individual pieces)
- 110+ installations on private property (over 380 pieces)

Key Art Hubs

- City Hall, Fire Station 5, Senior Center, and Center of Community Life all showcase art collections.
- Explore larger developments to find more art tucked throughout the campuses.
- Enjoy standalone pieces in parks and murals on private property.
